- 1. Chair's Welcome & Goals for Today's Meeting Meeting was called to order by Executive Director Pokey Harris.
- 2. Roll Call David Newberry called the roll. All attendees were by phone or Teams only.
- **3. Executive Director Opening Remarks –** Pokey Harris made opening remarks. She advised the 2021 Technology Committee goals were approved at the December 2020 Board Meeting.
- 4. November 12, 2020 Meeting Minutes Approval Motion by Bo Ferguson and seconded by Jude O'Sullivan. Minutes vote was unanimous.

- 5. Legislative Update Richard Bradford provided the legislative update. Document attached
- 6. ESInet/GIS Implementation Update -- Gerry Means provided NG911 project status updates. He advised there are 64 PSAPs active on ESInet. Cabarrus County, Concord, and Kannapolis are scheduled to migrate week of January 11. He advised that migration dates have been planned through September 2021. Means stated that there is competition for technical resources across the country. Chatham and Buncombe counties are TBD and may be pushed to 2022. All military installations will be ESInet only. Pokey Harris advised a point of contact has been assigned from the Army, Marines, and Airforce and are planning to engage the Coast Guard.
- 7. GIS Update Gerry Means advised 61 Counties are i3 ready. Means said the GIS governance model document is under review. This document will set standards for items such as who the GIS authority is and provide control mechanism for data. Means advised the document will be sent to Technology Committee after edits are completed.
- 8. NMAC- Stanley Meeks provided the NMAC update. He advised a tier 1 staff member was released at the end of the year. Contractor Kenneth Fullwood was hired. His previous position was with the AT&T Resolution Center. Gerry Means advised there is a plan to add more staff in 2021 due to more PSAPs coming online. Gerry Means advised the SolarWinds application was taken offline as it was an impacted release. He advised no malware has been introduced into the AT&T network. He advised the



loss of the application has an impact on proactive monitoring but does not impact ability to process tickets. Pokey Harris advised staff will continue to monitor situation but not be looking for a replacement.

- 9. Cyber Security Gerry Means advised 36 final reports have been issued. The contract with End-to-End ends in March. He has asked End-to-End to provide proposal to extend contract until June. Means said he expected to bring contract cost number for approval at February Technology Committee Meeting. Means advised Motorola is proving to be challenging and have not allowed vulnerability scans. They also have not produced scans completed by Motorola. Pokey Harris advised engagement from NC Emergency Management, NC National Guard, and other partners may be required.
- **10. SIP Admin Line –** Gerry Means advised the SIP circuitry is installed and should be able to test numbers in January. He advised there is significant interest from the PSAPs
- **11. Technology Committee Goals –** Gerry Means provided an update regarding the December Continuity Planning seminars. Means advised there is commitment to 60 ESInet migrations with a target of 64 for 2021.
 - **a.** Cyber Security Framework Means asked for volunteers to develop cyber security framework. Glen Knox and Randy Cress volunteered.
 - b. GIS ALI Perform analysis of AT&T application for automation. Pokey Harris directed Regional Coordinators to have conversation with PSAP community for volunteers. Rachel Bello volunteered to participate.
 - c. Hosted CAD exploration– Pokey Harris advised a SWOT analysis will be paramount and a work group will need to be assembled including PSAP, law enforcement, and fire/EMS. Ms. Harris advised a vendor for facilitation of discussions may be required.





<u>Striving for</u> 99% project completion by 12/30/2021 considering the potential for continued COVID impacts to scheduling and implementation resources. At present there are four PSAPs in the TBD designation that we are working to complete in the 4th qtr. 2021 that are doubtful. Continuing the effort to anchor above dates to secure vendor resources and then slotting PSAPs in dates as the ongoing COVID-19 environment evolves.

Additional project notes:

- COVID protocols for on-prem vendor resources to segment personnel from cross utilization at multiple PSAPs during mandated 14-day quarantine windows.
- Continued work with NC based military bases with latest discussions concerning technical reviews and GIS considerations. Ft. Bragg and Seymour Johnson have CPE contracts and deployments in flight. Camp Lejeune TBD.
- PSAPs live as i3 have now surpassed those initially implemented as RFAI. Thirty-four PSPAs are operating as i3 versus 32 as RFAI.



GIS Update

NC Next Generation 911 GIS Services webpage

- Sixty-three counties with production i3 ready GIS data or live as i3.
- Counties must have data fully compliant 60 days prior to NG911 migration ORT
- Thirty-four (34) PSAP jurisdictions are live as i3.
- Still at (8) counties that have made little or no GIS i3 progress.
- GIS Governance Model document is in final draft form and awaiting approval from staff and CGIA. The Governance model provides guidance on the maintenance of the i3 data sets along with roles and responsibilities at the State and local levels. Copies of the draft can be furnished upon request.

NMAC

- Adding NMAC as resource point for GIS support by centralizing post ESInet i3 requests for ALI
 data with the NMAC. Allows ticketing of requests to build analytics on the level of activity and
 to provide operational consistency.
- With the recent Solar Winds data breach the NMAC the team has been investigating other alternatives but nothing to report as yet.
- New staff added in January, Kenneth Fullwood who comes to us from the AT&T Resolution Center. Kenneth worked in the RC supporting 911 and other public safety related network services.

- Project extension to June 30, 2021 due to COVID delays and workarounds.
- Proposal from EEC has been formalized and accepted. Funding request to be voted on at the February 911 Board Meeting. Additional expense to be incurred is \$296,243.68. New contract total is \$1,481,218.40.
- Made good progress this month with the resumption of kick off meetings. Kickoffs will continue throughout the month. Also got several long delayed kickoffs activated and moving forward.
- Detailed analysis of the demographics of the final reports issued so far will begin this month. Analysis will be ongoing as the assessments for all PSAPs are completed. Summary of highlevel preliminary findings is anticipated by the end of the engagement.
- Analysis will provide the framework for the NG911 Cyber–Security Governance policy document using a similar framework as the GIS Governance policy document.

SIP Admin Lines Update

- Transport circuit orders are complete, and circuits are up in Columbia and Raleigh.
- Routers installed.
- A software version release for the Viper instances is required to activate the SIP admin line function and is in motion.
