A ceremonial swearing in was performed by Pokey Harris and Secretary Piccione for Ryan Holden, the newest NC 911 Board member.




March 911 Board Meeting


Business As Usual








Meet the NMAC Team




Renovations Continue....



Workshop Information:

Throughout the learning experience, participants will engage with theoretical and research-based concepts, examples of practical applications, and hands-on practical exercises to address a diverse range of learning styles. The program combines classroom education and hands-on application, enabling participants to develop a systematic approach to optimizing mental and physical health, increasing job effectiveness, and promoting career longevity and retention.

EAT - Fueling and hydration for performance, meal planning, and daily implementation of healthy habits for teams and individuals.

SWEAT - Pre-habilitation, injury prevention, pain science, recovery for career longevity, conditioning for performance, foundations of movement and lifting, and programming in practice.

THRIVE - Optimizing mental performance under pressure, breathing, yoga, integrated restoration (irest) for tactical athlete performance, stress factors, behavioral health, building resilience in high-risk jobs, the impact of sleep on performance, and how to create healthy sleep habits.

The 911 Board is paying for the course registration, which is free to the PSAP. This course is not an eligible Emergency Telephone System Fund expenditure, so per diem, lodging, and travel are not eligible. Course registration closes Wednesday, May 21. The registrant will receive a separate email to confirm registration. Cancellations will be accepted until May 21. For any cancellation after this date or any noshow, the PSAP is subject to reimbursing the Board for a cancellation fee.

NC 911 Board Budget and Service Charge Rate Approval

The NC 911 Board Members approved the FY2026 911 Board Budget, which includes budgeted amounts for continuing NG911 telephony service, including multiple enhancements such as video capabilities and text translation should the PSAP choose to take advantage. The budget also includes costs associated with the PSAP Managers Conference, grant opportunities for PSAPs, statewide projects beneficial to the PSAPs, and the PSAP distribution.


As a reminder, CAD-to-CAD reimbursement requests are due no later than May 15, 2025.

Grant Abstracts

Grant abstracts were due on April 11, 2025 PSAPs who submitted will receive staff responses by April 25, 2025, acknowledging receipt.

Grant Applications Due

The grant application for the FY2026 cycle is due by May 30, 2025, by 11:59 PM. No grant applications will be accepted after this deadline. Be sure to have your eligibility requests submitted by May 1, 2025 to PSAP eligibility for review for any grant projects.





Answering the Call at 30,000 Feet

As a Telecommunicator, you typically have a servant's heart, and that doesn't change just because you are on vacation! Ask Tim Roten, a Telecommunicator with the Wilkes County Sheriffs' Office!

On February 28, 2025, Tim was sitting at the Raleigh-Durham International Airport, awaiting his flight to Las Vegas, Nevada for his well-deserved vacation. While peoplewatching at the gate, he noticed a female who didn't look well. She looked pale and was acting rather lethargic. As luck would have it, she boarded his flight. About 45 minutes into the flight, a Delta flight attendant came across the speaker and asked if there was anyone on board with medical experience. Tim looked around, and realized he had to act. even though he was on vacation. Tim spoke up and was ushered to the back of the plane, where he met the female passenger, he had observed in the airport terminal. He began evaluating the 53-year-old female, who was complaining of chest pain (8 out of 10 on the pain scale) and had extremely high blood pressure. I should mention, not only is Tim an EMD, he is also an EMT-B and, prior to his job with Wilkes County, Tim worked as a radiology tech at Atrium Wake Forest Baptist in the Cardiac Cath Lab, so talk about right place at the right time!

Tim was given a medical jump bag and a headset with a direct line to air traffic control, the Delta pilot, and a physician on the ground with Delta airlines. Tim was given orders from the physician to administer chest pain protocol with baby aspirin, nitroglycerin, and oxygen. After three nitroglycerin tablets, the patient's blood pressure had dropped some, but was still very high. She reported her chest pain had lowered to a 7 out of 10. At that point, the Delta pilot asked Tim his opinion on whether to continue to Las Vegas or divert the flight and land immediately. Tim advised his major concern was that the patient could have a heart attack or a stroke, so he recommended the fight divert to land as soon as possible. The pilot took his advice and immediately asked for permission to land in Tulsa, OK. Upon arrival at the gate, the patient was immediately assessed by paramedics and then transported to the nearest medical facility. Afterward, the flight continued to Las Vegas and Tim had a wonderful time on his vacation!

Tim stated, "Some people might not have spoken up, but I knew I had a duty to act, and I feel my previous medical experience helped me to care for the patient, and my experience as a Telecommunicator helped me to relay information to the pilot, air traffic control and the physician on the ground!"





Answering the Call at 30,000 Feet(Cont.)

Tim has since learned the patient was later released from the hospital and was able to continue her flight to Las Vegas. He was glad to know his swift actions helped to save the life of a fellow passenger and ensure she had more time here with her family. At both work and vacation, Tim "answered the call" to help someone in need.

Way to go, Tim!







