Onslow County is in the middle of an EOC renovation. Telecommunicators continue to answer 911 calls as renovations take place on their building for the expansion of the County's EOC.










PSAP Assessment Coordinator Report

<u>Understanding the Concurrent</u> Call Path Forward.....

Whether you are speaking about the ESInet or SIP administrative service, you can cross the line...off your list. We now use paths...concurrent call paths that is.

A "concurrent call path" refers to a virtual pathway used to handle multiple phone calls simultaneously within a VoIP system, typically over an internet connection. A concurrent call path is a modern, flexible way to manage calls compared to the older, more limited copper wire system. Essentially, a concurrent call path allows for many calls to happen at once without the limitations of physical copper wires.

So ditch the word "line" from your vocabulary when it comes to 911 service here in North Carolina!



Transitional Data Management Services

With the start of the new AT&T Contract Amendment, we have kicked off several of the new features. One of those is TDMS (Transitional Data Management Services). The service allows GIS data to serve as the authoritative source for 9-1-1 address validation. With this service, AT&T will replace the jurisdiction's legacy tabular MSAG with a GIS-derived validation to ensure continuous synchronization of carrier subscriber records submitted for SOI validation against the jurisdiction's GIS data. This approach ensures continuous ongoing synchronization with GIS updates submitted by the jurisdiction through AT&T's Spatial Interface and simultaneous support for NG9-1-1 GIS and legacy address standards.

To sum up the benefit: after the implementation, when a jurisdiction successfully uploads clean data to DataHub without critical error, the process automatically creates the MSAG. This means PSAPs should no longer have to manually update their MSAG.

Brunswick was the first and only PSAP to request this service, and with consistently accurate GIS data, they were selected to pilot the project so a workflow could be created. Brunswick successfully went live on February 24, 2025.



FY2026 CAD-to-CAD Cloud Based Subscription Services

For the FY2026 cycle, 21 PSAPs submitted for new projects or recurring costs associated with CAD-to-CAD cloud based subscription services, totaling in a \$724,810.59 commitment by the 911 Board to PSAP interoperability for the receipt and dispatch of 911 calls. Board staff are currently working on approval letters to be sent out soon to the awarded PSAPs. Congratulations to those who submitted!

Did you know?

If any PSAPs did not submit for FY2026 for the CAD-to-CAD cloud based subscription, but are interested in moving forward with a CAD-to-CAD cloud based subscription project or are paying recurring costs during FY2026 for the subscription, 50% of the costs would be eligible to come out of emergency telephone system funds, provided the PSAP has an MOU with a partnering PSAP for receipt and dispatch of 911 calls.




FY2026 Cyber Security Remediation Initiative (CRI)

FY2026 CRI proposals from Johnston County 911, Perquimans-Gates 911, and Union County 911 on February 28, 2025. The approved amount for the three PSAPs \$317,726.65.

How can my PSAP apply for CRI?

The next CRI application period will close in mid-December 2025. PSAPs that wish to participate in future CRI cycles should start now by assessing the PSAP's cyber needs and beginning the planning process with the PSAP's IT staff in preparation for proposal submittal. 
NMAC and 911 Board Office Renovations




Brett Renfrow with Johnston County 911 Retires!
