Meeting Minutes:

- 1. Madam Chair called the meeting to order at 10:01 am
- 2. Pokey gave opening remarks
- 3. Mr. Bradford gave a legislative update. He spoke about the State legislature beginning their session January 13th. Mr. Bradford spoke about federal legislation specifically FCC fee diversion that was included in the updated CARES Act. Mr. Bradford shared a summary with Pokey and she displayed that summary on the screen. Mr. Bradford advised before, the FCC had no recourse to hold states accountable for fee diversions from the five states who did and this legislation will allow the FCC to create or adopt rules in 180 days related to fee diversion. Donna asked if these rules would affect NC and what is eligible for funding and Mr. Bradford advised at this time no. If legislation changed in NC then possibly, depending on the legislation. Donna spoke to one of the items on the review Mr. Bradford submitted specifically Colorado recognizing telecommunicators as first responders. Donna spoke to how that has affected some telecommunicators receiving the COVID vaccine. Mr. Bradford advised that certainly did have an immediate impact on telecommunicators. Pokey spoke about the states who have begun adopting telecommunicators at the state level as telecommunicators as this failed to gain a lot of ground federally.
- 4. Stephanie presented the AdHoc policy that was approved by the education committee and Mr. Bradford. No questions were asked on either the EMD or the Training portion of the policy. Dominick Nutter made the motion to approve the policy and Candy Miller seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.
- 5. Madam Chair then moved to priorities. A sub committee was created to address goal number three from the Standards Committee. Candy Miller, Dominick Nutter and Christy Shearin agreed to participate on the committee and will reach out to other PSAPs of varying sizes so there is fair and concise representation on the AdHoc committee. Candy Miller has agreed to be the chair of the AdHoc committee.
- 6. The conversation then moved to Peer Review. Tina and I will help to lead a committee to review the document and rules and will recruit PSAP Managers that are not currently in committees to assist. Madam Chair suggested the new supervisor in Moore County.
- 7. Finally, conversation was had on goal number two. This will encompass other committees as all will be needed to accomplish the goal. Gerry spoke on conversations he had with Rachel Bello and the possibility of a committee was discussed with a name of Next Gen or Emerging Technologies committee.
- 8. The Ad Hoc Policy was revisited. The original vote was not on the policy the Education Committee approved. Angie sent that to Stephanie and the policy was shared and reviewed. No questions were asked and the original vote was rescinded. Candy Miller made the motion to rescind the original vote and Dominick Nutter seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously. A new motion was given to approve the present Ad Hoc policy from the Education Committee, Candy Miller made the motion, Dominick Nutter seconded the motion, and motion passed unanimously. No further conversation on topic.
- 9. Pokey wrapped up the policy conversation and Tine adjourned the meeting at 11:09.
