


### Statewide Municipal Boundary Resource Goals

- Maintain a single municipal boundary resource to serve the needs of emergency management, state agencies, US Census Bureau, and other stakeholders.
- Streamline the boundary change reporting process and reduce reporting burden on local governments.
- Provide regular review and quality control opportunities for all partners
- Pilot test of procedures was successful.
