Current state of website accessibility

WebAIM Million

- Top 1 million web sites
- Evaluated using <u>WAVE</u>

 (automated web accessibility evaluation tool)

The results from Feb. 2024


56,791,260 distinct accessibility errors

56.8 = average # of errors per page



Common types of accessibility failures

- Missing alt text
- Low contrast text
- Ambiguous link text
- Improper heading structure





What is alt text?

- Added in the alt text box or attached to image metadata
- Imagine describing the image over the phone
- Be detailed, but succinct
- Include imperative information
- Context is everything
- What happens if I remove the image?



Who uses alt text?

People:

- Using screen readers
- Using speech input software
- Browsing speech-enabled websites
- Accessing a webpage that isn't loading images


Also, images become indexable by search engines (SEO).

All <u>non-text content</u> that is presented to the user has a <u>text alternative</u> that serves the equivalent purpose, except for the situations listed below.





Accessing alt text: screen reader

- Chrome OS: ChromeVox
- macOS: <u>VoiceOver</u>
- Windows OS: Narrator




Accessing alt text: Chrome "Inspect"

- Right-click the image and select "Inspect."
- Look for the tag in the Elements pane of the Developer Tools.
- Check for an alt attribute within the tag.

Writing effective alt text

3 types of images

- 1. Informative images
- 2. Decorative images
- 3. Functional images



Informative images

- Provides content
- Need alternative text near the image or in an alt attribute (alt=)

What to include when describing image

- Type of image (not "image of")
- Text
- Who is in the image
- Setting of the image
- Color(s)
- Expression and emotions
- Item locations and descriptions

- No content, just visual appeal
- Alt text "Decorative."
- Empty alt attributealt=""

Functional images

- Initiate action rather than convey information
- Buttons, links, interactive elements
- Need alternative text nearby or in an alt attribute
- Include description of the image & makes it clear where the link goes



Image used alone as a link

Alt text indicates where the link will take the user.

Image is decorative. Alt text would be redundant.

Alt text coveys meaning of the icon.

Alt text conveys the purpose of the icon.

Hashtags/links in alt text

If you have a link or hashtag to share, include it in the body text, not the alt text.



Automatic alt text


"May be an image of food and text."

"May be an image of outdoors."

Do not rely on the A.I.-generated alt text. The result is often vague and does not provide context or adequate information about the content of the image.
