Subject: Public Agency Reporting Requirements Under N.C.G.S. 143-805

Date: May 29, 2025

On Dec. 20, 2024, the N.C. Department of Information Technology <u>issued a memo outlining a requirement</u> <u>under N.C.G.S. 143-805</u> that mandates public agencies to report to the State Chief Information Officer details about unauthorized incidents of viewing and attempted viewing of pornography on government networks and devices.

This memo provides further information about who is required to report, what information is required, and how and when you should submit your reports.

Who Must Report

All North Carolina public agencies, as defined by N.C.G.S. 143-805(g)(5), are required to report.

Required Information

You or someone you delegate should submit the following information on behalf of your agency:

- The number of incidents involving unauthorized viewing and attempted viewing of pornography on networks and devices (e.g., laptops, desktops, and mobile devices) belonging to public agencies
- Whether the individuals involved were employees, elected officials, appointees, or students
- Whether incidents occurred on public agency-controlled devices

You only need to submit confirmed incidents, whether they were observed, found using content filters, or discovered another way. Please see <u>N.C.G.S. 143-805</u> for more information.

FY 2025 Reporting Period

- The reporting period for FY 2025 (July 1, 2024, to June 30, 2025) is July 1 to Aug. 1, 2025.
- No action is necessary if you have nothing to report.
- Submit information via NCDIT's reporting website at <u>it.nc.gov/805</u>. Please note: the webpage is currently available only for you to view. You will not be able to submit information until July 1.
