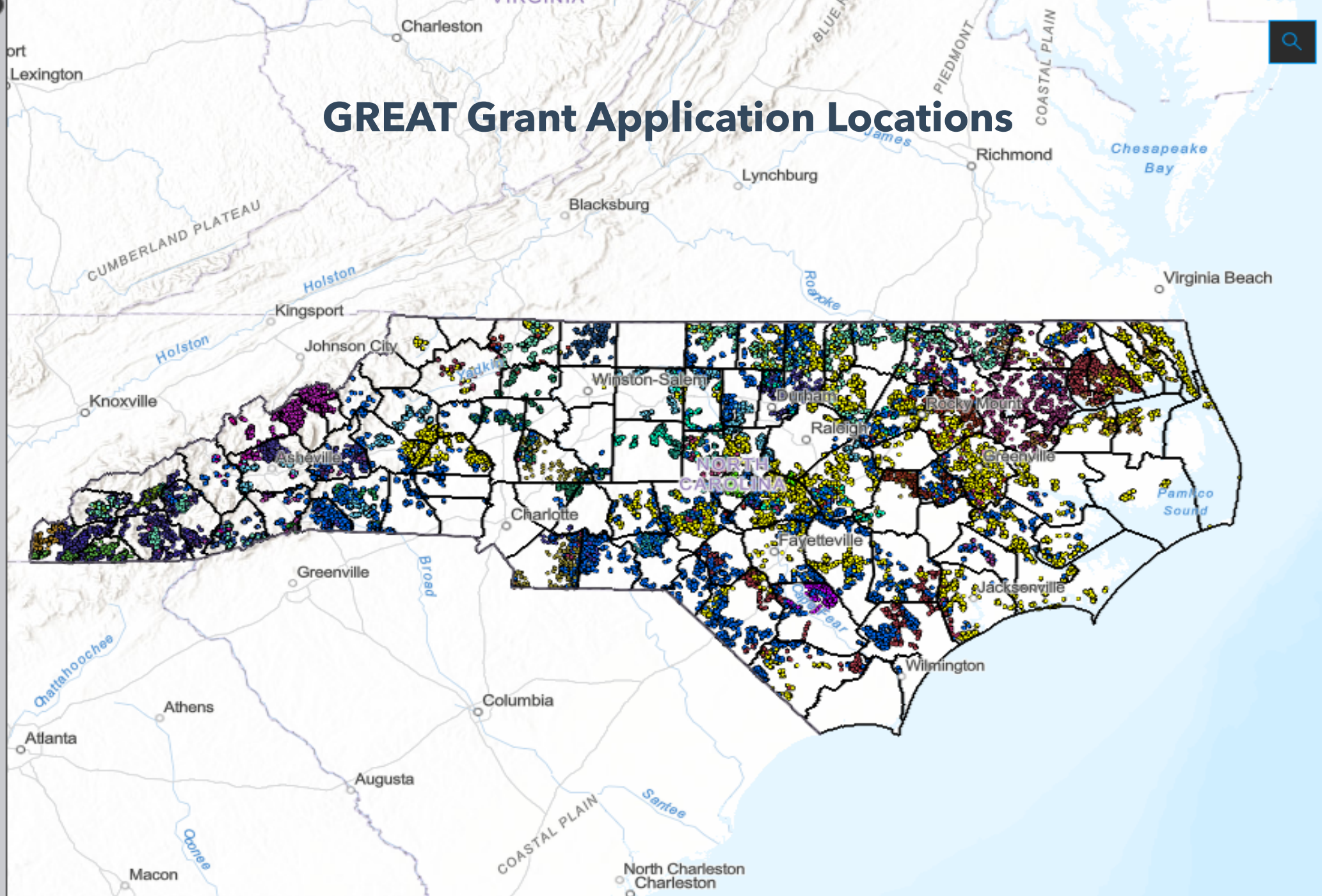

# Broadband and Digital Equity implementation progress

GREAT → Received 305 GREAT grant applications to serve 94 counties

- Applications proposed to serve more than 487,000 businesses and homes
- Protest and public posting close Sunday, June 19; protest review and scoring; awards in July
- Broadband mapping and data lead hired

Completing Access to Broadband → Draft program guidance posted for review in mid-June

- Program to officially launch in 2022 Q3; Program manager hired
- Developing convenience contract, prioritization based on county readiness
- Unfunded GREAT applications

Coronavirus Capital Projects Fund application submitted to U.S. Treasury on June 16

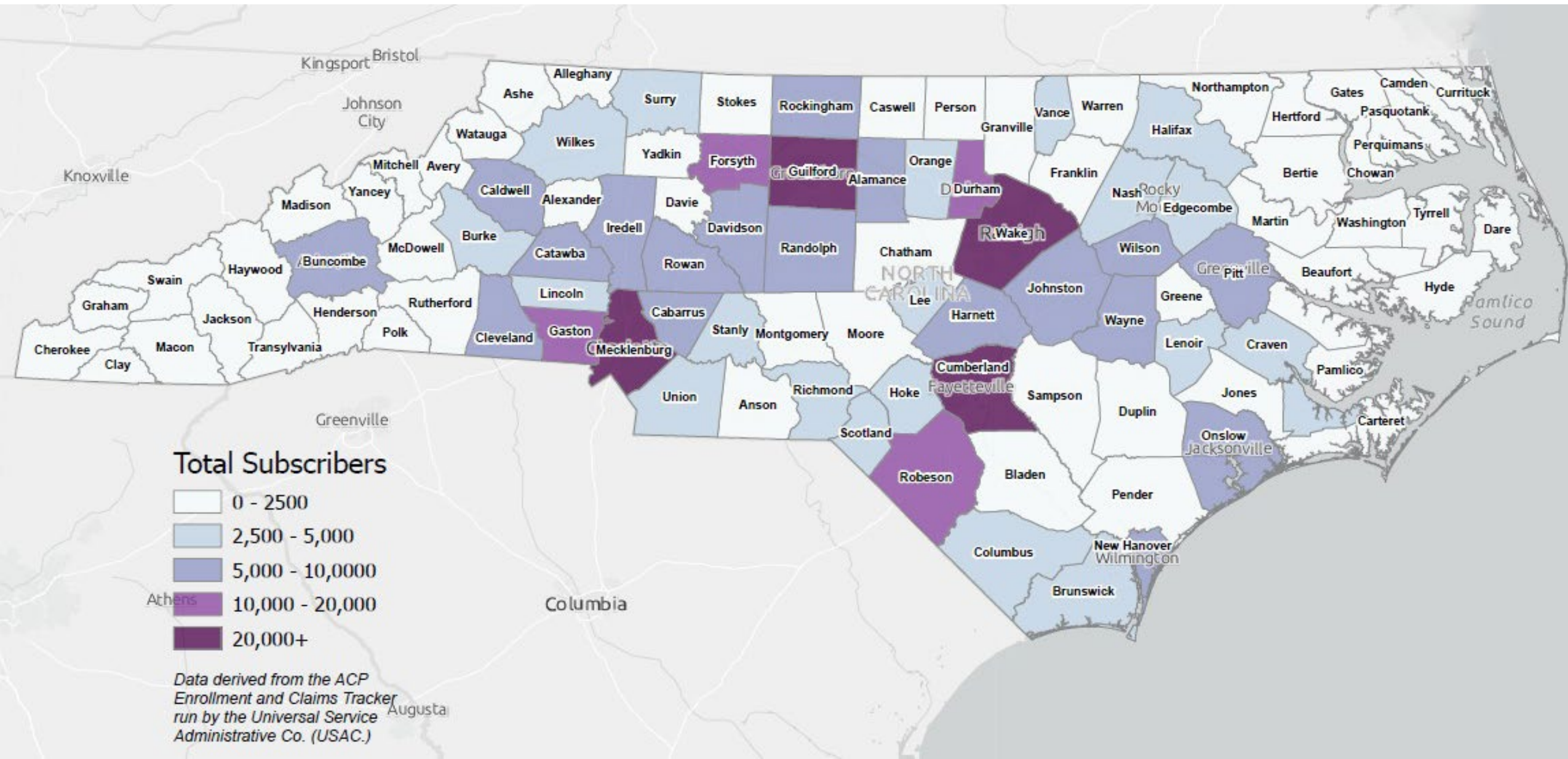
Broadband Pole Replacement Program → Posting program manager position

# Bipartisan Infrastructure Law Funding

Program	Total U.S. Funding
<b>FCC's Affordable Connectivity Program</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Provides \$30 per month subsidy for qualifying households; Up to \$75 subsidy for households on Tribal lands</li><li>• One-time discount of up to \$100 for a laptop, tablet or desktop computer (with a co-payment of more than \$10 but less than \$50)</li><li>• 20 internet providers now offering \$30 high-speed internet monthly plan; details at <a href="https://www.getinternet.gov">getinternet.gov</a></li></ul>	\$14.2 billion
<b>Broadband Equity, Access, and Deployment (BEAD) Program</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• High-cost areas (\$4.245B), Formula grants (\$37.356B)</li><li>• Initial minimum allocation of \$100M per state or territory</li><li>• Must include affordability component; prohibits exclusion of municipal networks</li><li>• NC signed on May 16; Initial planning funds application due Aug. 15</li></ul>	\$42.45 billion
<b>Enabling Middle Mile Broadband Infrastructure Program</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Application opens June 21</li><li>• Application closes Sept. 30</li></ul>	\$1 billion
<b>Tribal Broadband Connectivity Program</b>	\$2 billion
<b>State Digital Equity Planning Grant Program</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Planning application or letter of intent due July 12</li></ul>	\$60 million
<b>State Digital Equity Capacity Grant Program</b>	\$1.44 billion
<b>Digital Equity Competitive Grant Program</b>	\$1.25 billion

Digital equity planning funds awards	Sept. 29, 2022
Middle mile competitive grant applications due	Sept. 30, 2022

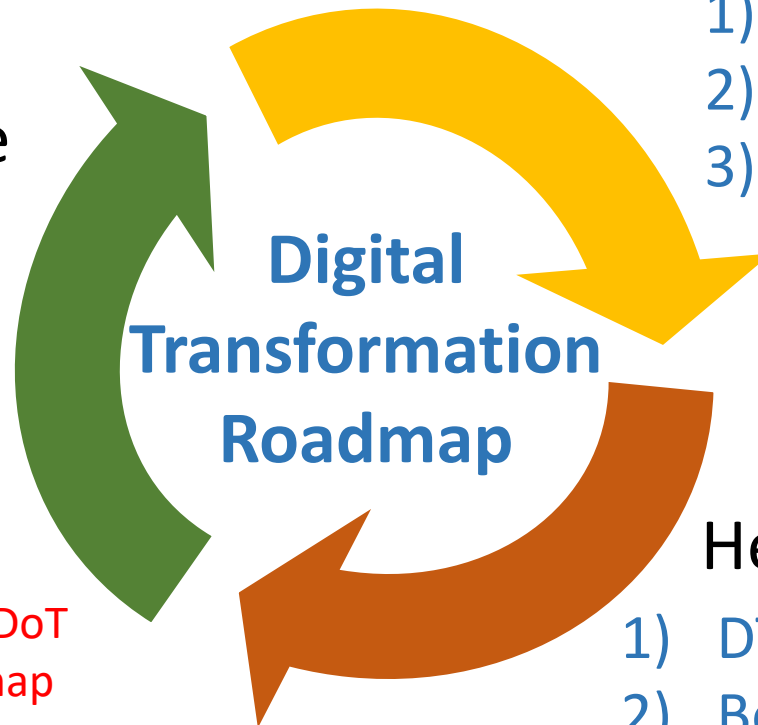
