



Scope of DIT: Budgeting

- DIT, Relevant Agency, OSBM, Controller develop and implement process for:
 - Agency IT budgets
 - Amounts transferred to DIT
 - Rates and chargebacks
 - Identify necessary cost savings and rules or statutory changes

• FY15-16
