## **Population Projections**

- Age (Single Years of Age, 0 99 and 100+)
- Sex
- Race (American Indian/Alaska Native, Asian, Black, White)
- Hispanic Origin (Total, White, Non-White)
- Population Estimates 2010-2016 and Projected from 2017 – 2037 (for projects to be released in October) (20 year projection horizon)
- Forecast models of time series trends (1990-2016)
  - ARIMA or Exponential Smoothing
  - Cohort Model to "Age" population

- Provisional Municipal & County Estimates (Late August)
- Certified Municipal & County Estimates September 15, 2017 (Statutory Deadline)
- Standard & Revised Municipal Estimates September 22, 2017
- Population Projections October 15, 2017




## **Future Plans**

  - Incorporate Alternative Scenarios




Components of Change by Period, 1950-2016







Net Domestic and International Migration, April 2010 to July 2015



Children & Young Adults Dominated Distribution of Movers into the State in 2015



#### North Carolina County Rurality Levels 2010







#### Projected Percent Change in Population by Major Age Groups, 2016-2036









#### **Dependency Ratios, 2006 – 2036** (Number of People in Dependent Ages For Every 100 People in the Working Ages of 19-64)




#### Change in Age Characteristics, 2010 - 2036





